

DESCRIPTION

How can we address exclusion in education due to disability, social challenges or communication issues? This course invites you to consider barriers to learning and look at strategies for overcoming them. You'll consider and evaluate options for creating more empowering, personalized and inclusive learning environments. You'll visit (innovative) schools and educational services for L2 learning needs that will inspire you, generate debate and comparative discussion among you and your fellow students, challenge you to evaluate practices, and offer you perspectives for progress.

LEARNING OUTCOME

(In line with EQFE Dublin descriptor criteria for B/M-level study)

You explore significant issues and challenges related to special educational needs and inclusion from a comparative perspective, articulating a preferred personal work theory on these topics. You base your comparison on knowledge and understanding of theories and practices concerning special educational needs and inclusion. This is further enriched by observations of various Dutch approaches in practice through on-site visits to schools and other institutions.

PREPARATION

Research on special educational needs in your home country.

As the course will address comparative issues, participants are asked to conduct pre-course research on policies and challenges related to special educational needs in their home country. Specifically, you will gather information on the topics listed below and prepare slides for presentation and discussion during the course. Topics may include:

- Services (infrastructure) for educational needs
- Philosophies of education underlying the care and learning provided
- Achievements and challenges in addressing special educational needs
- Major current developments in addressing special educational needs

FIELD TRIPS

- Visit to a museum related to inclusion
- On-site school visits

CREDITS

If you successfully complete this course, including preparation and assignments, you earn 2 ECTS credits.
